






WELCOME TO EXISTING AND NEW RALLIERS

A RALLY

A rally is a gathering of Caravan and Motorhome Club members who enjoy weekends away with fun and fellowship thrown in. Your Rally Officers will be people who have organised the weekend and will be the friendly faces that greet you when you arrive.

BOOKING

To book your first rally, fill in a rally slip which can be found online (www.wiltshirecentre.co.uk) with the required information and deposit as detailed in the rally write up, sign and post it to the organising rally officer. If you have to cancel for any reason please contact the rally officers and inform them as soon as possible.

TRAVEL AND ARRIVAL

When your rally weekend or holiday arrives, follow directions in the rally-write up, which will guide you to the vicinity of the rally. When you are close to the site you will see the yellow Wiltshire Centre signs at the side of the road these will guide you to the site (refer to page 42 for details). On arrival you will find the Rally Officers waiting for you at the rally office. This will normally be the first caravan inside the site and will be marked with a "Rally Office sign", once you have booked in you will be handed an envelope containing the programme for the weekend, sometimes a competition and of course your rally plaque as a memento of your visit. The Rally Officer will show you to your pitch where you will be requested to park with the front offside corner of your caravan on the marker and to park your car on the offside of your caravan (refer to page 50, paragraph 9 for details). You will be shown where the freshwater tap is and the elsan disposal point.

THE WEEKEND/HOLIDAY

The rally may include a social on the Saturday night, which is a family event. This may be a dance, a fancy dress or in the summer a BBQ. This will normally be stated in the rally write-up. Your weekend may also include competitions or games for children or adults alike. All these activities are entirely optional but are always good fun.

Usually on the Sunday morning refreshments will be held. This is a get together of all the ralliers to hear the results of the competitions, to welcome any visitors, to announce forthcoming events and rallies, hold the weekend/holiday raffle and most importantly to thank the Rally Officers for organising and running the weekend.

WHAT YOU NEED

To be a rallier you will require all the usual camping equipment plus a few extras. You must have your own toilet facilities, which must never be taken near the freshwater tap. You will also require a few blocks of wood for levelling your van on sloping fields and a dustbin liner to take your waste home with you.

FINALLY

Please do not arrive any earlier than the time stated in the rally write-up. There is always a good reason for the opening time stated by the Rally Officer.

Always take a look at your map against the location details provided in the rally write-up, this can save you a lot of time and frustration later on, especially if you are arriving in the dark.

Please, do come along to see what it's all about; we all look forward to meeting you and your family.



The Rally Booking Slip has been revised to include a section to indicate if any member of a rallier's family holds a "Blue Badge", as, given that information, Rally Officers can pre-plan where members will be sited. This may, on some sites, assist such members and make their rallying experience that much more enjoyable. It must be accepted however, that on some sites it is not possible to make any significant allowance for such members.

The Committee would be pleased to hear of any further ideas that could enhance the rallying experience of those with mobility or other issues.

Three Words That Could Save a Life

A company, 'what 3 words', established in 2013 has developed a system for communicating geographical locations within a resolution of three metres. What3words is a really simple way to talk about locations using just 3 words rather than lengthy GPS coordinates which could easily be miscommunicated.

Any location can be written as /// word1, word2, word3 and the words are available in 37 languages with more on the way. What3words (W3W) have divided the whole world into 57 trillion 3x3 metre squares and given each square a unique address that will never change. Many locations in the world don't have an address in the usual format but now every small square in the world has a unique simple address that's easy to communicate.

W3W addresses are easy to say and share and are as accurate as GPS coordinates. The location of the entrance to the what3 words head office in London for example is:-

51.520847, **- 0.19552100** in GPS coordinate form, or ///**filled**, **count**, **soap** which do you prefer?

What3words make sure that similar sounding W3W addresses are a long way apart so that if a W3W address is entered slightly incorrectly, and the result is still a valid W3W reference, the error will be immediately obvious. For example if the London address in the previous paragraph was mistakenly given as ///filled.countS.soap you will find it in Oregon USA!

Some manufacturers such as Ford, Mercedes, Jaguar and Land Rover are adding W3W into some Satnavs for voice input. W3W is now also widely used by 62 emergency services and the list is growing all the time, as its invaluable for accurately locating those in need, especially when out "in the middle of nowhere" as we ralliers often are.

In addition to emergency services you may find such addresses useful for locating friends, maybe on a beach or in a caravan or tent, on a site or outdoor event. Imagine trying to find a friends tent at somewhere like Glastonbury Festival! Now you can. You can use W3W addresses on a computer or tablet or on a smartphone just download this app on to your smartphone or android.



With the smartphone app you need to have a good GPS signal, but you don't have to have mobile data available to find your W3W address. Similarly, when out in the open the app allows to navigate to a W3W address using your phones compass; the accuracy is only limited by your device.

You cannot currently type these W3W words into Google Maps but you can enter them into the what3words app or website for viewing or navigation.

You will find more information and examples of usage on the what3words website: www.what3words.com in the business and about us sections. It's well worth a look.

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WILTSHIRE CENTRE-PAYMENT FOR RALLIES

Rallies may be paid for in the following ways:

- a. General deposit a standard payment of £10 paid at the time of booking, or
- b. Full balance paid prior to arrival at the rally (or a remaining balance).

In both instances, Bank Transfer (BACS/Faster Payment) is the preferred method of payment, in order to keep Bank charges to a minimum. Please contact the Treasurer or the Rally Officer if this causes a problem.

It is important the Treasurer and the Rally Officers concerned know who, and how much, has been paid on each occasion, so that reconciliation of the Rally Accounts and the Centre bank accounts can happen as quickly as possible.

Please follow these steps:

1. Make the payment to:CAMC Wiltshire Centre

Reference: Rally # (insert rally number from Rally Book or website booking

reference).

2. Send an email to: treasurer@wiltshirecentre.co.uk

With the following details: "Paid by Bank Transfer" then.....Your name, amount transferred, date payment made, which rally (date, name and number), purpose (deposit/balance/full payment).

3. Contact the Rally Officer (email/phone/text) with the same information.

NOTE: if this is a deposit/booking for a rally then a Rally Booking Slip MUST be posted/emailed to the Rally Officer.

If you are unsure of how much to pay, please contact the Rally Officer before commencing this process.

Failure (or a delay) in sending this information, will cause confusion and a large amount of work trying to track down information for the Rally Officers concerned and the Treasurer.

Please remember, all those running a Rally and the Committee are volunteers who give up their free time to enable us to rally, and an additional workload is unfair.

COULD YOU BE A RALLY OFFICER

So that we may enjoy our rallies to the full we need Rally Officers to help run them. We hope that the following guidelines will help you to decide that supporting the Centre in this way is well worth doing. If you feel that you can help us in this way, please contact our Rally Secretary.

Please remember it is your rally and you can make it as simple or as complicated as you wish. It is not a competition to see who can make the biggest rally. Whatever you plan, you can be assured that the Rally Secretary or any Committee Member will be willing to help and offer any advice that you may need.

VENUE

Contact the venue to book the rally. Once date and price is agreed, fill out the rally confirmation form (found on the proforma file, this will be supplied by the Rally Secretary) and ask the venue to sign it and return it back to you. Keep this signed confirmation as it is the agreed contract with the venue.

RALLY PLAQUES

Rally plaques need to be ordered from the Plaque Officer at least 21 working days before the rally.

THE EQUIPMENT

Rally signs:
These need to be put up as they direct ralliers to the site.

Other signs: Dogs on lead, Rally Office etc need to be displayed. Centre sail:
Not always required on a commercial site, but it will help ralliers to find you on a large site

HELP

WANTED

Pitch markers: These mark out the pitches for the units.

Some of these items are usually passed from rally to rally but if that has not been possible, the Equipment Officer will be holding them. The Equipment Officer will contact you a few weeks (approx) before the rally asking what equipment is required.

PRIOR TO THE RALLY

You will need to acquaint yourself with the site. This will enable you to plan the siting of the caravans/motorhomes and know where the fresh water and elsan points are. When siting caravans/motorhomes please remember the 6 metre rule. The committee's recommendation is 9 metres minimum for simplicity (peg to peg).

You will need an attendance sheet from the accounts package showing the ralliers attending and any visitors who attend the rally venue. If you are not sure how to do the paperwork, please ask the Treasurer or any member of the Committee who will be pleased to help.

RALLY TIME

Arrive in plenty of time to get yourself sited preferably by the entrance to the rally so that people may see you as they arrive, check the equipment, get the signs out, peg the field out if needed and get the centre sail up. Then relax until the ralliers start to arrive.

COULD YOU BE A RALLY OFFICER (Cont.)

As a Centre we are well known for a cheerful welcome. As ralliers arrive, tick them off the attendance sheet so that you know who is in and how many more units to arrive. As members are directed to their pitch, it is also an opportunity to give directions for the freshwater supply, waste point and elsan point. When the ralliers pay hand out any other paperwork or rally information you may have created. You will be given envelopes by the Rally Secretary.

Unless you have made special plans for the rally such as competitions, games or any entertainment, you can now relax and enjoy the rally. Do make yourself available to act as host/information point especially as there may be first time ralliers or CAMC ralliers from another centre who want advice as to places to visit/walk etc.

REFRESHMENTS AT 11.00AM (NORMALLY SUNDAY)

Rally Officers to invite ralliers to come together at a central point, around 11.00am on the last day of the rally, typically near the rally office. It is normal practice to supply tea/coffee and biscuits but this is up to the Rally Officer.

The Rally Officers thank the ralliers for coming and give out the results of any competitions that you may have run. The Chairman or a member of the Centre Committee will present the Rally Officers with a memento for running the rally.

If you are unsure of running a rally, ask someone else if you can assist them first to get to know how running a rally works and then hopefully you will run one yourself.

AFTER THE RALLY

As soon as practicable after the rally, complete the accounts and pay in any money to the bank account and return the receipts (if any) to the Treasurer. If in doubt when completing the accounts, ask the Treasurer.

Unless the rally equipment is being passed to someone else, please return it to the equipment holder where you obtained the equipment. If there are any issues with any part of the equipment, please inform the Equipment Officer.

The legal requirement for towing mirrors is to allow you to see clearly an area that is 4 metres wide from the side of your caravan for a distance of 20 metres behind the driver.

As a caravan is wider than a car and large 4x4 to ensure compliance with the law, towing mirrors are essential.

Failure to comply could result in a fine and 3 penalty points.





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
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





PITCH SPACING RULES RELATING TO RALLIES




Minimum Spacing: The minimum spacing between facing walls of adjacent motorhomes and caravans (the unit) is to be 6 metres. Given that the maximum allowable motorhome/caravan width is 2.55 metres this means a minimum peg-to-peg distance of 8.55 metres. **The committee's recommendation is 9 metres minimum** for simplicity.




<u>Clearances:</u> There must be 3 metres clear between "outfits" where the outfit includes the "unit", car and awning or pup tent. Taking the case of a rally where no awnings/tents are allowed, then the 9 metre peg spacing is sufficient, as the maximum width of a car is 2.55 metres.



If cars are parked remotely and awnings/tents are allowed, then providing the awning/tent is less than 3 metres deep, and most are, then the 9 metre peg spacing also works.




If cars and awnings are both allowed, the peg spacing should be 11 metres minimum to provide the 3 metres between outfits



Roadways: As most units are around 7m in length, with a few of around 8m, **the Committee recommends a minimum of 14 metres** between peg rows.

This ensures a decent access road to all pitches, and eliminates the necessity to "drive through lines". It also ensures simplicity in adhering to the rules above.



WILTSHIRE CENTRE RULES RELATING TO RALLIES

- Any site or part of a site on which a Rally is held shall be for the exclusive use of members of The Caravan and Motorhome Club's caravans. The attendance at the site and/or payment of Rally fees shall be the acceptance by the Members of these rules
- 2. Bookings for Rallies: Slips should be in the hands of the Rally Officer at least 14 days before the rally. Rally plaques are given out at Rallies providing that the slips have been received in the given time. No acknowledgement of booking slips is made unless a stamped addressed envelope is enclosed with the booking slip. When booking a rally, Members accept the Rules of the Centre and the Caravan and Motorhome Club.
- 3. The Rally Officer is responsible for the organisation and conduct of the rally, and subject to Club policy, will formulate his/her own Rally programme and make all decisions on the site. Members are expected to give all the support they can.
- 4. If you do not attend a Rally after booking, you must contact the Rally Officer concerned and pay the costs incurred on your behalf.
- 5. All cars and units that are towed from muddy or waterlogged fields are towed at the owners' risk and no claims can be made against the owner or driver of the towing vehicle, or against Caravan and Motorhome Club insurances. Any remuneration towards fuel expenses for towing vehicles can be claimed from the Centre Rally fund.
- 6. Every Member must report to the Rally Officer on arrival at the site before pitching the unit and must be prepared to substantiate his/her identity by producing a current Membership Card, if requested to do so by the Rally Officer.
- 7. If you are expecting visitors, they are required to call at the Rally Office on arrival at the Rally.
- No unqualified drivers or drivers under instruction will be allowed to drive on the rally field. Driving speed on the site is <u>Walking Pace</u> or less for <u>ALL</u> vehicles, including bicycles.
- 9. Each unit and towing vehicle must be placed on the pitch indicated by the Rally Officer, with the front offside of the caravan on the marker peg. The towing vehicle must be parked parallel and close to the side of the caravan unless otherwise instructed. (Please refer to diagram on page 49).
- 10. Members must bring their own toilet facilities to all Rallies.
- 11. The erection of tents, except toilet tents, is not allowed on the Rally Field except by permission of the Rally Officer, and, if permitted, are to be erected within the "awning space" of the pitch, not in addition to a full awning.
- 12. A bucket, or suitable receptacle, which is not allowed to overflow, must be used for all collection of waste water and emptied at the disposal points provided, or as instructed by the Rally Officer.
- 13. Chemical toilet contents must be deposited in the receptacle or place provided and marked with the "Toilet Disposal" sign, or as instructed by the Rally Officer.
- 14. All rubbish must be taken home unless the Rally Officer has made other arrangements.
- 15. All dogs, cats and other pets must be kept under control. No animal may be allowed loose on the site and leads must not exceed 3 metres in length. Animals are not to be exercised on the Rally Field. All "accidents" are to be picked up immediately.
- 16. Parents are expected to keep their children under control both on the field and at social events. Games, particularly ball games, including tethered ball games, must not be played, or kites flown, in close vicinity of the vans.

WILTSHIRE CENTRE RULES RELATING TO RALLIES

- 17. Members must ensure that radio sets, televisions, musical instruments, etc., are operated at a reasonable volume so as not to cause annoyance to other members at the rally. In consideration of others the Rally Field should be quiet from 11:00pm onwards until a reasonable time the following morning so that ralliers may sleep undisturbed.
- 18. Presentation of Centre Pennants may only be made by the Chairman or his designated representative.
- The Centre accepts no responsibility for any injury or damage sustained by, or caused by, any person attending a rally and/or entering any competition on their own, or the Centres, behalf.
- 20. Motoring competitions and motoring practices will not take place without the full approval of the Centre Committee.
- 21. Matters for discussion at Committee Meetings must be submitted in writing and with the Secretary at least 14 days before the meeting.
- 22. In no circumstances will a Member be permitted to open an account in any bank to which centre monies might be accredited.
- 23. Letters or Contracts dealing with Centre events or rallies, where monetary liability of more than £300 is involved, must have copies made and one copy must be forwarded to the Centre Treasurer.
- 24. A Yellow Flag will be flown indicating restriction of vehicle movement due to adverse conditions on the Rally Field. Any vehicle movement may only take place with the express permission of the Rally Officer.
- 25. All monies raised for any charity at any Centre events must be paid to the Centre Treasurer so that the donation can be made in the name of the Centre and a receipt obtained.
- Deposits for Rallies shall be governed by the criteria published in the "Terms & Conditions" applicable to rally bookings, and published on page 53 of this booklet.
- 27. Generators in caravan lines shall only be permitted to run on a rally between the hours of 10:00am until 12:00 noon and 5:00pm until 7:00pm as long as they are suitably silenced in order not to cause annoyance to other Members.
- 28. E-Cigarettes and other "vaping" devices will be treated in the same way as tobacco products, and any restrictions on tobacco products will also apply to E-Cigarettes and other "vaping" devices.
- 29. There is to be no driving between units, and/or the markers for units, unless expressly instructed to do so by, and under the strict control of, the Rally Officers. All vehicular access is to be along the designated rows only.
- 30. Amendments to these Rules shall be by Proposal and Vote at AGM, however the Committee may make Temporary Amendments which must then be ratified at the next available AGM.

The Caravan and Motorhome Club Bye-Laws (correct to 8th August 2016) and Caravan and Motorhome Club Centre Rules (correct to 1st August 2016) are obligatory rules to all Centre Members. (Copies in the Club Handbook).

These Wiltshire Centre Rules, relating to rallies, are supplementary to the obligation, which all members undertake on joining the Caravan and Motorhome Club, which include the Caravan and Motorhome Club Bye-Laws, Caravan and Motorhome Club Centre Rules, The Caravan Code and the Country Code, but in the event of any variance these rules shall apply.

Also applicable are decisions made at Centre AGMs, on matters other than Rallies, copies of the current Standing Minutes are published in the Committee Guide and are available from the Secretary) Amended October 2019, due to issue of "Terms & Conditions" for the booking of rallies.

RALLY BOOKING TERMS AND CONDITIONS

There are two types of rally deposits:

- a. Pre-payment (pre-paid) where either the full payment or a large proportion is required before the rally.
- b. General deposit a standard payment of £10 is required for all other rallies.

In both instances, Bank Transfer (BACS/Faster Payment) is the preferred method of payment, in order to keep Bank charges to a minimum. Please contact the Treasurer or the Rally Officer if this causes a problem.

PLEASE SEE "PAYMENT FOR RALLIES" PAGE 15 FOR FULL DETAILS.

Pre-payment (pre-paid) deposits

- 1. This may be the entire cost of the rally or just the Social event organised at that rally. This may range from 50p up to the total cost.
- All pre-paid deposits will be refundable <u>less any expenses incurred on behalf</u>
 <u>of the rallier</u>. This may range from just the admin fee to any costs incurred for
 any Social event tickets that the rally officer is unable to resell.
- 3. Any pre-paid deposits paid by cheque should be banked and forwarded to the Treasurer without delay and are not to be held by the Rally Officer. Cheques are not valid if post-dated.

General deposits

- 1. The deposit paid will be used as part payment towards that rally if paid by Bank Transfer.
- 2. If paid by cheque, this can be dated to the start date of the rally, or left blank, and used as part payment or returned to the rallier upon arrival at the rally.
- 3. The deposit will be banked as a "forfeited deposit" if cancellation is made within 14 days of the rally, or in the event of a non-arrival.
- 4. If cancellation is made more than 14 days prior to the rally, or in the event of the Rally being cancelled by the Committee (Rally Officer) due to weather or any other circumstances, mutual agreement is made for the return of the deposit (via the Treasurer, Rally Officer and Rallier). This is on the assumption that no other costs have been incurred on behalf of the rallier.

Deposits for the following years rallies paid at the AGM may be paid either by BACS (preferred method) or via a dated/undated cheque.

If you cancel a rally due to ill-health or bereavement, the Centre Committee will consider a full refund, if so requested. This will be at the Centre Committee discretion and considered on a case by case basis.

All members booking a rally undertake to reimburse the Centre for any expenses incurred on their behalf that are not covered by any deposit amount, whether they attend the rally or not.

All members booking a rally undertake to abide by the CAMC and Wiltshire Centre rules and regulations.

All members booking a rally accept that **THE ORGANISERS ACCEPT NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PROPERTY OF PEOPLE ATTENDING THE RALLY.**

RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR CENTRE TROPHIES COMPETITIONS

Any member attending a Centre Trophy Competition must be a bona fide member of the Rally at which the competition is being held, (with the exception of the Pickwick Shield, see Rules). In the event of outfit (caravan, motorhome or trailer tent) failure within 48 hours of the Rally and as long as the deposit and site fees have been received and not refunded, the member is permitted to take part in the competition. Entry into any of these competitions acknowledges acceptance of these rules.

Competition voting ages for children will be 5 to 17 for voting on children's competitions. They will have to be 18 and over to vote on adult competitions.

THE NORTHOVER TROPHY - (Observation Tour)

- Due to changing traffic conditions this is now a Drive and Walk competition.
- If walking from the Rally field is not possible, the car will be driven to a number of locations and parked. The answers to the clues will then be found on foot.
- Competitors must be members of the Wiltshire Centre and be fully paid-up members of The Caravan and Motorhome Club.
- One entry per caravan attending the Rally at which the competition is being held.
- To reduce the number of vehicles on the road members may share transport to reach the walking part of the competition. The length of drive shall not be more than 20 miles.
- Route cards are to be collected from the Competitions Officer from 9.30am on the Saturday morning of the competition.
- All entries to be returned the same day, at a time to be advised by the Competitions
 Officer.
- The number of clues to be between 35 and 45.

THE PICKWICK SHIELD - (Rally Book Cover Competition) A WINNING COLOURED ENTRY WILL APPEAR IN FULL COLOUR

- A competitor must be a member of the Wiltshire Centre, or immediate family (i.e. wife, husband, partner or child), and must be a fully paid up member of The Caravan and Motorhome Club.
- The Rally Book Cover Competition will be judged by Wiltshire Centre members at the AGM.
- The subject of the design may be a drawing, sketch, photograph or composition of anything to do with Caravanning, or of a fixed landmark in Wiltshire and can be in black and white or colour.
- The design should include the title: **THE WILTSHIRE CENTRE RALLY BOOK + (THE YEAR).**
- You should also include the Caravan and Motorhome Club logo & a small version of the
 horseshoe with the Wiltshire motif within it. If you do not have them, they will be
 added by the Competitions Officer prior to display and judging.
- Maximum size should be A5 Portrait format (The size of the Rally Book).
- A maximum of one entry per person.
- Entries should be in the hands of the Competitions Officer by 1.00pm on the Saturday of the AGM weekend, with the member's name and description of the subject written on the back.
- Members who wish to enter this competition need not be on the AGM Rally but must be attending the AGM.
- The winning entry will be used on the cover of the Rally Book, <u>subject</u> to the approval
 of the Committee, after consultation with the printer as to its suitability. Should it not
 be suitable then a runner up design will be used. (In this case the points won by the
 winner for The German Trophy will not be affected).
- Each voting member is to have 3 votes. ALL VOTES TO BE USED OR THE VOTING SLIP IS INVALID. This is to encourage members to vote for photographs other than their own. The first vote is worth 3 points, the second 2 points and the third 1 point.

RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR CENTRE TROPHIES COMPETITIONS (Cont.)

THE GREATFIELD SHIELD (Photographic Competition)

A competitor must be a member of the Wiltshire Centre, or be immediate family aged 13 years or over (i.e., husband, wife, partner or teenage child). Maximum of one entry per person.

This competition will be judged on the Observation Rally.

- The subject of the photograph will be a theme set by the Committee and published in the Rally Book, and at the end of these rules. It may be in black and white or colour.
- Maximum size 6" x 4" not mounted.
- Entries with the members name and description of the subject written on the back. should be in the hands of the Competitions Officer by 10.00 am on the Saturday of the Rally,
- Each voting member is to have 3 votes. ALL VOTES TO BE USED OR THE VOTING SLIP IS INVALID. This is to encourage members to vote for photographs other than their own. The first vote is worth 3 points, the second 2 points and the third 1 point.

THE DON ROBERTS TROPHY - (Senior Illuminated Caravan Side)

A competitor must be a member of the Wiltshire Centre, or be immediate family aged 18 years or over (i.e., husband, wife, partner or child), and be a fully paid-up member of The Caravan and Motorhome Club.

- The side to be illuminated must be part of the Member's Caravan, motorhome or trailer tent.
- The caravan, motorhome or trailer tent must be used for the Member's family to sleep in during the competition weekend.
- The theme of this competition will be set by the Committee and published in the Rally Book, and at the end of these rules.
- All entries to be parked adjacent to each other. No naked lights or generators to be used.
- Each voting member is to have 3 votes. ALL VOTES TO BE USED OR THE VOTING SLIP IS INVALID. This is to encourage members to vote for Illuminated caravan sides other than their own. The first vote is worth 3 points, the second 2 points and the third 1 point.

THE SWINDON CARAVAN CUP & BLUNSDON ABBEY ROSE BOWL-(Boules Tournament)

- This is a knockout competition for ladies and gentlemen.
- A coin is to be used to decide who throws the jack and first boule.
- The jack must pass the halfway mark on the court to be valid.
- All boules must be thrown underhand with the palm towards the ground.
- After both players have thrown their first boule the player furthest from the jack plays until becoming the closest to the jack or runs out of boules.
- Alternate ends to be played until one player reaches 11 points.
- Each player has 4 boules.
- Boules ending outside the playing area do not count.
- Tied ends become dead ends.
- The size of the playing area is to be no bigger than 3 x 12 meters.

RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR CENTRE TROPHIES COMPETITIONS (Cont.)

THE SARUM TROPHY & THE GREEN TROPHY - (Curling)

- Each player has 4 curling stones per round.
- Each player will play 3 or 4 rounds depending on number of competitors and weather on the day. This will be declared on the day before the competition starts.
- Points are awarded if the curling stone stops within a marked section.
- Scores are awarded for each section 5, 10, 20, 30, 40 or 50 points.
- The curling stone must be completely in the box, if any part of the stone is on the line
 it will not count.
- If there is a query in respect of whether the stone is in the box, the competition
 officers' decision is final.
- The stones should be returned by the rally officers using the broom only or a representative who will not be participating could be responsible for returning the stones to the start.
- The rally officer's partners will keep the score overseen by an independent adjudicator.
- The rally officers are permitted to participate in this centre competition and challenge for the trophies as their scores will be overseen by an independent adjudicator.
- If there is a tie of points for the winner, there will be a play off.
- Non centre members are unable to win the trophies as this is a centre competition but welcome to take part in the game.

THE GERMAN TROPHY

- Will be presented to the family that accumulates the most points awarded when competing in the Centre Competitions. Only one name to go on the trophy.
- 100 points will be awarded to the winner of a competition and will decrease by 1 point per place thereafter.
- When a full member and family members enter any competitions the best score from any one of them will be added to the cumulative score. The same will apply to any other competitions where more than one member of the family can compete, including teenagers.
- Only the TOP FIVE SCORES from any one family to count (i.e., you need only enter FIVE of the six competitions. If you enter all six, your worst score will be dropped).

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
